


SCRS-IL Regional Consumers Participate in Glendale Community College and Pasadena Community College Job Fairs




The student shows off the items she purchased from the college's farmer's market, where students receive a \$20 voucher to purchase goods on a weekly basis.





#### **Reaching Out to Our Communities**



### **Applause for Success!**



The Men of Color Action Network, an active support network that advocates for and provides resources to male students and faculty of color in California community colleges, held its 5th Annual Leadership Conference on April 7 at Pasadena City College (PCC).

This year's theme was Breaking Barriers, which acknowledges the strength that comes from the barriers men of color overcome.

Approximately 700 attendees from about 20 to 25 different community colleges, the majority of them from Southern California, registered for the free conference. One of our EDGE students registered for this conference and was provided transportation to and from the conference from their college. Our Education Assistant, Mr. Jose Madriz, accompanied the student to ensure an overall positive experience.

#### **Assistive Technology**

SCRS consumer, Ronny, reached out to us for assistance with modifying his current bath with a standard-size tub and replacing it with a walk-in shower. The consumer suffers from kidney failure and severe edema of his lower extremities. The consumer receives dialysis sessions three times per week. He has limited mobility and a very weak gait. Due to his affected stability, he is unable to raise his legs in order to go into the traditional standard bathtub. SCRS offered the consumer the opportunity to apply to the City of Whittier's Home Modification program. The consumer was deemed eligible and received a \$5,000.00 grant approval for the following modifications:

- 1. Removal of the old standard-size bathtub,
- 2. Installation of tiled shower tray (for walk-in shower),
- 3. Installation of tile walls with corner shelves,
- 4. Installation of grab bars in the shower area (multiple sizes),
- 5. Installation of an adjustable showerhead with a long hose combo,
- 6. Installation of an 18" chrome stainless steal grab bar at the entrance of the porch area by the steps.

The consumer has improved self-care through the modifications mentioned above. He is able to bathe himself independently. Additionally, he shared that he has begun to feel safer in the shower. The consumer also stated the grab bar installed in the porch area offers him extra support when walking. Ronny and his family were grateful for SCRS' assistance through the City of Whittier Home Modification program.
